#### TRILOKIA - Circo Aereo

Three short plays performed in three different venues (indoor, big top, outdoor) and forming a single show. Trilokia is a poetic exploration of man's relationship with the living world. Ieau, Ferfeu and Harbre are all performed by alchemist Jani Nuutinen.

Composed of chimerical images, we plunge into these creations as if in a dream, between dance, acrobatics and the manipulation of objects. Like a magician, the artist tries to master the elements. He transforms a space into a sheet of rippling water, defies fire, seeks to enter into communion with a tree.

In each of these paintings, he tells us a story about humanity. And he appeals to us to take our time, away from the urgency of the world.



#### Macacada - Maïra de Oliveria Aggio

Macacada is much more than a show; it's a sensory experience in three acts. Maïra de Oliveira Aggio created it after reading Franz Kafka's short story "A Report to an Academy," which tells the tale of a monkey who becomes human. Before an assembly of scholars, he explains how he integrated into human society by adopting its codes. Embracing her identity as a monkey, the artist blends personal narratives with decolonial reflections on stage. She begins by leading us to a tree transformed into an apparatus for acrobatics. This is followed by a performance-lecture exploring the concepts of Nature and Culture, where she cites quilombola philosopher Nego Bispo, a cornerstone of her creative research. She concludes with an intoxicating DJ set, inviting us to dance and celebrate our ancestral heritage. Maïra de Oliveira Aggio is a Brazilian artistresearcher. Having lived in Europe for thirteen years, she maintains a deep-rooted connection to the northeastern region of Brazil where she grew up (Salvador, Bahia). Macacada is her first solo performance, supported by the Antigone association, a collective that champions works created by women in the performing arts.

#### Face aux Murs - Cie Hors Surface

In an ever-evolving set design, two large trampolines face plexiglass walls that act as mirrors. Seven circus artists fall and rebound continuously, all defying the laws of gravity.

These acrobats push the "wall trampoline" technique to new limits, integrating it with other acrobatic disciplines (such as hand-to-hand, banquine, and counterweight). They break traditional codes with imagination, showcasing both their individuality and collective spirit. Face aux murs is a mirror: reflecting our present against our future, our human condition against an unpredictable world, and our ego against the Other. For the past ten years, the Toulon-based company Hors Surface has championed a new, multifaceted form of circus with high acrobatic standards. Poetic and visually striking, this company, led by Damien Droin, creates extraordinary set designs and expresses a unique language that blends original musical composition with high-flying choreography. Its artistic vision: to question the shifting space around us and our relationship to reality.

#### Sabotage - NoFit State Circus

After impressing us with Lexicon, a show brimming with boundless energy, the Welsh company NoFit State Circus returns with a new creation that's just as wild. Beneath a big top, in an atmosphere of shadow and light, nine extraordinarily talented performers push the traditional boundaries of circus, joined by three musicians.

In a series of breathtaking scenes, they interweave different aerial acts: acrobatics, hand-to-hand, aerial hoop, Chinese pole, slackline... These high-flying acts address a world facing tough challenges, grappling with various power struggles: population displacement, climate crisis... Delicate topics tackled here with boldness.

Hailing from Wales, NoFit State Circus plays a pioneering and iconic role in the development of contemporary circus in Britain. Their shows, directed by Firenza Guidi, combine music, theatricality, and special effects in gargantuan performances executed with absolute precision.

#### Miettes - Jules Sadoughi

In this acro-dance solo presented as a preview, dancer and circus artist Jules Sadoughi offers a poignant reflection on the passage of time and its impact on the body.

Through an expressive choreography of tight, rapid movements, the artist embodies a body that is at times vibrant, at times constrained. There is no set here—only a dancer-acrobat and a few symbolic objects explored for their meanings.

Having suffered multiple injuries, Jules Sadoughi has developed a paradoxical relationship with pain, experiencing a young body tinged with a sense of wear. This solo delves into the peculiar feeling of being both five and eighty years old, like a frenzied pup and an old, weathered bark. His performance lies at the intersection of these two extremes.

#### Armour - Arno Ferrera & Gilles Polet

Dressed as wrestlers, the three acrobats delve into questions of masculinity, aiming to offer a fresh perspective. The audience surrounds them, observing scenes of deep intimacy through intersecting gazes, in a tender and natural connection that makes them approachable.

In this physical engagement, the performers touch, grasp, and lift each other. They use armour made from sports protective gear not to keep one another at a distance, but rather to draw closer and connect.

Through captivating balances and hand-to-hand movements, they slip into relationships of redefined masculinity and seduction, presenting an image of love that is open, generous, universal, and multifaceted.

Performers Arno Ferrera and Gilles Polet first collaborated in 2021 on the duo Cuir, a piece by the company Un loup pour l'homme that explored masculinities. With Armour, produced by Les Halles de Schaerbeek, a cultural centre in Brussels, they expand on this theme, developing an acrobatic language focused on the notion of exhaustion.

#### La Bête Noire - Compagnie L'Oublié(e)

Becoming nothing but a body. A dehumanised body. In this solo, Raphaëlle Boitel engages in a performative choreography. As a metaphor for her past as a contortionist, this piece tells the story of a female acrobat whose work both damages her body and brings her joy.

In a beautiful set design, with play between shadow and light, she sketches out the battles she fought daily against her inner demons. On the ground or on an apparatus like a column representing her 24 vertebrae, she twists and contorts herself in countless ways, like a thread on the verge of snapping.

Her performance is a physical feat—a haunting mirror of the suffering we sometimes inflict upon ourselves.

Founded in 2012, Compagnie L'Oublié(e) is directed by theatre director and choreographer Raphaëlle Boitel. This company has a highly recognisable identity, blending various art forms (theatre, circus, dance, music, cinema) in each piece and inventing new apparatus. Each time, tragedy and comedy are evoked through a metaphorical narrative.

#### Petites Reines - Compagnie L'Oublié(e)

This biting, clown-inspired piece about control was born from the collaboration between director Raphaëlle Boitel and acrobatic cycling specialist Fleuriane Cornet. We follow Edith, a bright and optimistic young woman, as she grapples with the conflicting demands of the man she loves.

In an effort to free herself from her troubles and finally live with a clear mind, she embarks on a wild race. On stage, her bicycle becomes her playmate and confidant, the one to whom she reveals the pressure she feels.

In this sensitive narrative, we find all the hallmarks of Raphaëlle Boitel's work: acrobatic performances, an offbeat script, all brought to life in a remarkable interplay of light and shadow.

#### Hourvari - Compagnie Rasposo

In this grand-scale show, crafted as a storybook tale, enigmatic characters blur the line between reality and illusion. Created by the renowned company Rasposo, Hourvari takes a close look at our world, tossed between artifice and authenticity, illusion and tangible truth.

A "Hourvari" is a trick used by game animals when they retrace their steps to mislead the hounds. It also represents confusion, disorder, an unexpected difficulty, or a ruckus—a cacophony, clamour, uproar, or chaotic agitation. A "hourvari" can also mean a violent gust, a storm wind, or a tempest. Through theatrical staging and powerful imagery, this piece reflects on the fleeting nature of life, the passage of time, our vanities and intoxications, while also celebrating their beauty.

Marie Molliens is a true "child of the circus." From a young age, she was part of the shows by the Rasposo Company, founded by her parents. Trained at the Annie Fratellini National Circus School, she took over the artistic direction of Rasposo in 2012. Emerging from street theatre, this company advocates for a vibrant, intense, and radical circustheatre, performed exclusively under a big top.

#### Fora - Compagnie AR

Contorting oneself within a space that's too small. Struggling and then escaping. In this solo performance, Alice Rende uses her flexibility to excel in two disciplines: enterology (the art of fitting one's body into a space smaller than oneself) and escapology (the art of escape).

Inside a Plexiglass box, the artist appears trapped. Relentlessly, she moves up and down, pressing her body against the transparent surface. Through ascents and at times seeming levitations, she battles.

Yet, once free, torn between the fear of seeing herself as monstrous and the surprise of transformation, she continues to challenge these walls.

In Portuguese, Fora means "outside." In this performance, the word embodies the quest for freedom.

Through Compagnie Ar, based in Aix-en-Provence since 2022, Alice Rende explores contortion as a sensitive act, one capable of questioning and reshaping the pressures we face, which manifest in our bodies.

#### Every\_body - Alexander Vantournhout

A major figure on the Belgian scene, choreographer and circus artist Alexander Vantournhout invites us to explore, even dissect, everyday gestures. With dancer Emmi Väisänen, he skillfully breaks down and magnifies simple actions into a thousand images.

Together, they transform an ordinary handshake into an intricate sequence involving arms, elbows, and shoulders, and a seemingly endless walk into a multitude of leg movements.

A rich choreographic display in a psychedelic atmosphere, where the most subtle gestures are transformed into something remarkable. This performance is enriched by a soundscape created by Geoffrey Burton, guitarist for Arno and Iggy Pop.

Originally from Belgium, Alexander Vantournhout first trained at the École Supérieure des Arts du Cirque (ESAC) in Brussels before attending P.A.R.T.S. to study contemporary dance. Founder of the company not standing, he has created several pieces that merge these two disciplines.

You'll also find violins, guitars, quirky objects, and delightful accidents—all woven together to form a timeless, dreamlike circus that touches the depths of the human soul.

#### Le récit des yeux - compagnie Sombra

For over 20 years, Carlos Muñoz, a masterful juggler, has devoted himself to a form of visual and sculptural juggling inspired by photography, thus offering a discipline rarely explored in the circus. With The Tale of the Eyes, we are drawn into a hypnotic performance alongside him.

"The soul has two eyes," as they say, "one looks at time, the other rises towards infinity." This piece tells the story of a man's journey to Nowhere—a futuristic voyage.

In his quest, he is accompanied by circular objects representing eyes. These are living beings of sorts, manipulated by the artist to electronic rhythms. They move, distort, and create mesmerising optical illusions. A sci-fi atmosphere is guaranteed.

The Franco-Chilean company Sombra specialises in choreographic juggling. Carlos Muñoz develops projects here that revolve around object manipulation, music, and imagery. Attentive to detail, his creations are born from the meticulous observation of life and its movements.

#### Entre chiens et loups - Théâtre du Centaure

Premiered at BIAC 2025, this poetic performance is a quest for connection. Camille and Manolo are exceptional artists. For thirty years, they have been nurturing an intimate relationship between humans and horses. To them, the centaur is a poetic creature, a way of life, and a utopia.

Between Dogs and Wolves is a journey into the heart of their approach, navigating between the wild and the domestic. Accompanied by four stallions, these two artists embark on a mesmerising journey set to entrancing music. In bursts of energy or slow-motion embraces, they perform exquisite routines filled with vaulting and repetitive loops.

They offer us an organic dance choreographed for six bodies, until horse and human become one.

In Greek mythology, a centaur is a half-human, half-horse creature. In every production, Théâtre du Centaure draws from this legend. Founded in 1989 and based in Marseille, this company is led by Camille and Manolo, two unique and complementary artists—different yet inseparable.

#### L'Absolu - compagnie Les choses de Rien

A virtuoso artist, Boris Gibé blends circus, dance, and magic in this surprising and imaginative creation.

It all begins at the entrance to the big top. Inside a strange 12-metre-high silo, you're invited to take a seat along a spiralling staircase. Leaning against this dizzying structure, you witness a breathtaking, hypnotic ballet that tests the limits of the human body.

In a play of light and shadow, set to an entrancing soundtrack, an acrobat, suspended in mid-air, twists and spins. He performs astonishing movements, creating stunning tableaux. In a search for truth, the man battles against the elements—water, air, fire—pushing his boundaries to the extreme. L'Absolu tells an intimate journey, a flamboyant embrace of risk.

Each of Boris Gibé's creations is an immersive, sensory, and poetic experience. As part of the company Les Choses de Rien, the circus artist designs performances staged within travelling structures. True spectacles, they combine acrobatic and aerial techniques with dance and dramaturgy.

She also works with Circostrada to develop practical tools for artistic dissemination (such as Touring, Programming, and Funding Big Tops in Europe co-authored in 2024 with Axel Satgé)

After studying sociology, Simon Carrara joined Cie Archaos in 2001, helping to set up the company in Marseilles as administrative and financial director, before setting up BIAC with Raquel Rache de Andrade and Guy Carrara in 2015. From 2019 to 2022 he also coordinated the CircusLink European cooperation project. He is currently deputy director of Archaos, Pôle National Cirque and BIAC - Biennale Internationale des Arts du Cirque.


#### Gwénola David (Facilitator)

#### Richard Fournier (Speaker)


Richard Fournier is the director of Le Plongeoir, the National Circus Centre in Le Mans. At the helm of Le Plongeoir since 2022, he is responsible for an artistic and social project entitled 'le cirque au quotidien' (the circus in everyday life), with which he will be awarded the Pôle national Cirque label by the French Ministry of Culture in 2023. He was previously artistic director of the Soirs d'été festival (street arts and circus) in Le Mans from 2016 to 2019, and has been artistic director of the Le Mans fait son Cirque festival since 2016.



#### Danijela Jović (Speaker)

Danijela Jović, originally from Yugoslavia and based in Brussels, is a Performing Arts Project Officer and Call Coordinator for Perform Europe, promoting sustainable, inclusive touring and the Cooperation projects in Western Balkans. She works for the European Education and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) and has contributed to initiatives like Culture Moves Europe. As former coordinator of the Structured Dialogue Access to Culture platform and the FEDEC network, she specializes in performing arts, artists' working conditions professional skills, and residency programs. A founding member of the female OKUP collective, she produces participative projects for urban regeneration and public space reappropriation.

#### Guy Périlhou (Speaker)

Guy Périlhou, with a background in economics and a passion for the performing arts, especially circus, has championed French cultural policy for over 30 years. He served as a consultant and evaluator for the Ministry of Culture (1988–1994), production director of Cirque Gosh (1995–2002), co-founder of Hangar des Mines (1995–2003), and founder of La Verrerie d'Alès / PNC Languedoc Roussillon (2004–2015). Since 2017, he supports three artists: Marie Molliens (Cie Rasposo), Julien Candy (Cie La Faux Populaire), and Sébastien Le Guen (Lonely Circus).



#### Lucho Smit (Speaker)

In 2007, Lucho Smit co-founded the Galapiat Cirque company, with which he creates shows, organises festivals and develops social and cultural activities on a structural basis in Brittany. Since 2016, he has been regularly asked to act as an outsider and director for creative projects. In 2023 he will also take over as artistic director of Festival Circolo in the Netherlands.

#### Rosalie Gonzalez (IN SITU)

Specialised in the management of international cultural initiatives, Rosalie coordinates IN SITU, the European platform for artistic creation in public space. In the past she monitored cultural projects in various fields such as Mediterranean cooperation and safeguarding museums and intangible heritage in the Middle East.



#### Loïc Magnant (FAI-AR)

Since 1998, Loïc Magnant has worked for several projects in various territories with cultural engineering. He is the president and cofounder of the Bureau des guides du GR2013, a unique cultural organization anchored on the metropolitan hiking trail born from the European Capital of Culture. Since May 2023, he has been director of the FAI AR, higher education course in art in public spaces, certified by the Ministry of Culture.



#### Alexis Nys (Lieux Publics)

In 2007, Alexis Nys founded Productions Bis, a production company dedicated to live performances and unconventional projects, supporting public space artists and developing international cooperation initiatives. At the same time, he joined the association Animakt, a 'living workshop for the arts, connections, and culture,' where he took on the role of artistic coordination and institutional development until 2022. In January 2023, he was appointed director of Lieux Publics, CNAREP, which oversees the Cité des Arts de la Rue, a space for artistic, ecological, and social experimentation located in the northern districts of Marseille.

#### Karin Holmstrom - Begat Theater (Lieux Publics)

Since 1992, Begat Theater has been devising performances that use public space as a venue to explore private and subjective experiences, producing work that defies street theater conventions as they are practiced today. Highly immersive, the work blurs the boundaries between the real and the fictional and places the spectator in an active role.



#### Pauline Murris (FAI-AR)

During her philosophy studies, Pauline narrowed her field of research to cinema. She then joined the École Supérieure d'Art Dramatique of Paris as an actress, before working with various artists and companies. With Janette Cie, she explores the boundaries between the real and the fictional, and places the spectator in an active role. With « Se Sauver », she tries to introduce fictional characters "on the run" in the daily life.



#### Zoé Pannier (FAI-AR)

Zoé has assiduously practiced contemporary dance and music at a conservatory in the outskirts of Paris. After high school, she launched multiple cross-disciplinary projects, and then organised various events. Since leaving the conservatory, she has worked in a street company, created collectives, and opened squats and creative research laboratories.

Her work develops around the notion of performative pedagogy, she works with participating audiences to intervene in the place of practice. She questions the non-rule and the game through choreographic tools of improvisation to explore our communication and interaction systems.



#### Nana Francisca Schottländer (IN SITU)

Based in Copenhagen, Nana Francisca Schottländer is working with emerging hybrids in the intersection between dance, performance, installation- and conceptual art.



#### Zelda Soussan (Lieux Publics/FAI-AR)

Zelda Soussan is a director of participatory performances in public space and a performer. Trained in Brazil with the Erro Grupo, she graduated in 2017 from the 6th promotion of the FAI-AR (Higher Training of Art in Public Space, Marseille) and created the LUIT - Urban Laboratory of Temporaries Interventions. She works on developing theatrical practices born from the observation of the territory, to reflect on participation in theatre, as a sign of participation in democracy.
