FOREWORDS

Welcome to the 5th edition of FRESH STREET, the International Conference for outdoor arts, co-hosted by Circostrada Network and Out There Arts, in the frame of the Out There Festival in Great Yarmouth!

We welcome a fantastic range of speakers and delegates from across five continents, who have come together to explore the theme of placemaking - and we have certainly come to an interesting place to do it. Great Yarmouth is a town that has been through many changes - as a fishing and cargo port, a military base, a major seaside tourism and entertainment resort and a growing centre for energy. Circus and Outdoor Arts have been playing an important role in this place for a long time. Our morning discussions are taking place in the incredible Hippodrome Circus - the last remaining historic circus building in the UK, owned and thrivingly run by the Jay family. As a National Centre for Outdoor Arts and Circus, Out There Arts has been a driving force in the cultural life of Great Yarmouth, growing the Out There Festival over the past 17 years and shaping the identity of the town year-round from its Drill House creation centre, nestled in the vibrant Little Portugal quarter. This week, on the opening night of FRESH STREET #5, it also launches its new venue, the Ice House, giving fresh life to another of the town's historic landmarks.

This year's FRESH STREET #5 programme also shines a spotlight on "situated and unannounced voices", a theme developed through Circostrada's VOICES project, co-funded by the European Union. It invites us to listen more closely to marginalised narratives, to reimagine the relationships between people, spaces, and artistic creation. FRESH STREET #5 is part of a long-standing commitment by Circostrada Network to foster knowledge exchange, increase the visibility of outdoor arts and contemporary circus, and influence cultural policy-making across Europe and beyond. Every two years, FRESH is hosted by a different Circostrada member in a new location, offering unique local perspective while addressing global challenges. In the post-Brexit context, this edition of FRESH STREET is also a timely opportunity to reaffirm the strong cultural connections that continue to link the UK, Europe, and beyond.

Over three days, we will come together with artists, producers, academics, researchers, activists, environmentalists, funders, urbanists, community leaders, writers, funders to discuss ideas facing outdoor arts, the places we inhabit and the times we live in. Has outdoor arts lost its revolutionary spirit? Are we here only to gentrify cities and entertain tourists? What is the future for us in the face of growing inequality and overstretched public services? How can we bring different people together in a more divided world? What is the value of increasing participation in creation and performance? How do we stay sane and creative in the face of global environmental decline? What can we do to defend public space for cultural enjoyment and selfexpression?

FRESH STREET #5 explores all these questions through a rich programme of talks, workshops, participatory experiences, performances, installations and celebrations.

We urge you to get Out There and get involved!

TRAVELLING TO GREAT YARMOUTH A quick reminder of the must-know info before you go!

PLANNING YOUR TRIP TO GREAT YARMOUTH

For delegates coming from an EU country, make sure to apply for an electronic travel authorisation (<u>ETA</u>), mandatory for all travels starting from April 2nd, 2025.

For delegates coming from a non-EU country, make sure to check to check the <u>VISA requirements</u> applying to your country in order to travel to the UK.

Don't forget your UK power adapter!

UK plug sockets are different from those in Europe, so make sure to bring a suitable adapter, an adapter for type G power sockets, to stay poweraed up.

HOW TO GET TO THE UK?

Recommended Eurostar arrival station (from several cities in France, Germany, the

Netherlands and Belgium): St Pancras International (London): underground (Hammersmith & City, Circle or Metropolitan line) from St Pancras \rightarrow

direct to Liverpool Street Station.

Recommended airport of arrival: Stansted Airport (London):

direct train from the airport to Norwich \rightarrow second train to Great Yarmouth. Norwich Airport (Closest airport to Great Yarmouth): bus to Norwich train station \rightarrow then train directly to Great Yarmouth. We recommend you choose one of these two airports.

If you arrive at other airports, please check your itinerary and keep in mind that you will need to go to London Liverpool Street train station for your connection.

Other options:

Luton Airport (London):

train from Luton Airport Parkway \rightarrow Farringdon, then a Tube from Farringdon \rightarrow London Liverpool Street (via the Elizabeth Line), then another train from London Liverpool Street \rightarrow Norwich, final train Norwich \rightarrow Great Yarmouth.

Gatwick (London) Airport, then Gatwick Express train \rightarrow London Victoria \rightarrow London Liverpool Street \rightarrow Norwich \rightarrow Great Yarmouth.

Train:

Greater Anglia runs regular services from London Liverpool Street Station to Norwich and Great Yarmouth. Check out their website here.

Great Yarmouth Train Station is 1 mile away from The Drill House/Hippodrome (roughly an 18-minute walk, 10 minutes by bus). Taxi services are also available from the train station

Car:

Car Parks close to The Drill House: Market Gates multi-storey NR30 4BQ, Palmers Car Park, NR30 3JP, King Street Car Park, NR30 2PS. The seafront has a selection of car parks to choose from. For further information, click here.

Bus:

First Bus East Anglia runs regular services from Norwich and East Coast areas to Great Yarmouth. Find out more here.

All buses arrive at Market Gates, a few minutes north of The Drill House and The Hippodrome.

Ferry:

Dover UK - From Calais / Dunkerque and drive to Great Yarmouth (3h30hours) Harwick UK - From Hook of Holland and drive to Great Yarmouth (2 hours).

Bicycle:

The Drill House is accredited under the Cycle Friendly Places scheme by Cycle UK. This means we can provide you with a secure zone to lock up your bike and help you with repairs and punctures.
