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What is a General Meeting and why you should connect & attend?

General Meetings consist of a 3-day meeting between network's members, held twice a year in a different European country.

HERE IS ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW!

General Meetings can be regarded as the foundations of the network, in the sense that they are an ideal opportunity network's members to meet. exchange, share, think together, get to know each other better, discover an artistic landscape, explore topics relevant to their daily work-life, learn about network's activities, experience what it actually means being member... and so much more! These meetings take place twice a year and are hosted and co-organised by a Circostrada member in the frame of a festival or an artistic event.

They are always designed around a full and tailored-made programme that is specific to the local context of the organisation hosting it, but still deliver meaningful content for both circus and street arts professionals.

A privileged sphere to learn about the life of the network, meet the Coordination team and Steering Committee, get to know new members and learn about what they do.

A chance to discover a new circus and street arts scene, learn about other European cultural contexts, visit key venues and meet local stakeholders.

An invitation to work with your peers, get involved in the network's activities and contribute to its development via its five internal workgroups.

An occasion to increase your skills and refresh your perspectives by participating in thematic workshops, projects presentations and peer-to-peer exchanges.

Chiara Organtini is a curator, passionate about interdisciplinary art and public space, from site specific interventions, digital experiments or participatory works that question traditional genres and spectatorship. For 12 years she was part of indisciplinarte, an organization that supports arts as an agent for urban change: she contributed to the development of CAOS Centro Arti Opificio Siri, a 6,000 sqm multidisciplinary space based in a former factory in the post industrial city of Terni and to the curation of Terni international performing arts festival. In 2019, she joined Santarcangelo Festival, specifically working on BEPART art beyond participation, a Creative Europe large scale European cooperation project, which aims to investigate collaborative forms of art making and the ethics of participation.

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 10


DAY#2

Speaker: Friso Wiersum (The Netherlands)

Friso Wiersum (1976) is a program maker, moderator and connector. Educated as a historian, currently Friso works as project manager communications at the European Cultural Foundation. Friso is also a member of Expodium, an urban do tank which curates, teaches and publishes on art and the city. He sometimes reviews books, dj's with Kako Da Ne collective, helps boarding some foundations, and rides his bicycle.
