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INTRODUCTION

LEADERSHIP IN TIMES OF CRISIS

How can we best manage our teams and organisations in times of crisis?

Is the current pandemic exacerbating social inequalities and how can we ensure greater gender equality, diversity and inclusion in decision making now and in the future?

In the aftermath of this crisis, how will we need to advocate in order to sustain our organisations and our sector?

A crisis is unexpected, unplanned for and incredibly unsettling for organisations and individuals alike. The current Covid-19 pandemic is forcing us to rethink and behave in ways that may feel unfamiliar and unexplored, demanding a great sense of adaptability from cultural leaders and emphasizing the need to develop resilience, empathy and a richer understanding of our sectors.

Co-organised by XTRAX, the purpose of this CS lab is to question how, as cultural leaders, we can support our teams in these unprecedented times, while at the same time using it as an opportunity to question our practice and explore ways to instigate lasting change in our organisations and the wider sector.

It will combine a range of workshops, focused discussions and inspirational talks addressing the topics of leadership, equality and advocacy in the street arts and circus sectors. We will reflect on the current situation and look at how we can lead through a crisis while maintaining a sense of perspective and examining the landscape we want to create in a post-covid-19 world. We will ask ourselves whether our sector is as diverse and accessible as it appears and how we can play an active role in instigating lasting change.

A TAILORED-MADE WEBINAR

A NEW FORMAT

Originally designed as a three-day residential laboratory, this CS Lab has shifted its format to accommodate the circumstances dictated by the COVID-19 pandemic. The event has now taken the shape of an elearning and information sharing experience, allowing the network to trial an exciting new online format for the first time.

WHO IS IT FOR?

The keynote sessions are open to anyone working in the fields of Outdoor Arts and Circus, including festivals, artists, producers, creation and performance spaces, cultural centres and development agencies from across Europe. The practical workshops are open primarily to Circostrada Members and XTRAX guests (10 participants per session).

She has worked across all spheres of circus from traditional touring tented circuses to large-scale outdoor spaces and intimate touring indoor theatre.
